WEST Midland neering and electronics firms could be in for a bonanza after a government decision to replace the RAF's ageing Lockheed Hercules transport aircraft.

The company has estimated that a decision to buy the new plane would result in advanced engineering and electronics work worth about around £160 million flowing into its Birmingham factories.
