who at the time of his death had a fixed place of abode at Rowney Green, and aforesaid, within the District of the County of Worcester

was proved and registered in the District Registry attached to the Probate Division of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice, at Worcester and that Administration of the personal estate of the said deceased was granted by the aforesaid Court to

William Henry Coghmore and Elizabeth Andrews, Widow, the Relict of the said deceased, the Executors

named in the said Will. They having been first sworn well and faithfully to administer the same.

And it is hereby certified that an Affidavit in verification of the Account of the said estate has been delivered, wherein it is shown that the gross value of the said estate amounts to £ 12 - 5 - 0 and no more.

This is the last Will and Testament

George Andrews of Rowney Green Awechurch in the County of Worcester. I hereby revoke all wills and instruments heretofore by me made. I appoint William Henry Ashmore of Rowney Green in the County of Worcester, and Elizabeth Andrews Wife of the above George Andrews of Rowney Green in Parish of Worcester to be the Executors of this my Will. I give and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth Andrews all my household furniture and all moneys and all moneys due to me for rent etc of which I have at the time of my decease out of which my said Wife is to pay all my just debts funeral and other charges and I devise that ^{the} ^{an} ^{the} my freehold messuages outbuildings gardens and premises together with a piece of land in the occupation of the Messrs H and J. Andrews and unto my said Executors In Trust to permit my said Wife to live rent free in one house and to receive the rent of the other house and also the rent of the piece of land for the term of her natural life without damage or waste for her separate use and free from the debts of any future husband And from and after her decease Upon Trust that they my said Executors who they may appoint to sell the same and discharge all legal expenses incurred and pay all moneys with all convenient speed and divide the same between my sisters hereinafter mentioned Mary Ann Manton Charlotte Manton Widow, Harriet Andrews Spinster, Eliza Griffin Wife of John Griffin and my children as may be living at the decease of the said Elizabeth Andrews to share equally and alike in proportion. Witness my hand this second day of November 1838
