1. I appoint William Henry Ashmore
 of Rounney Green aforesaid Farmer and Henry Ward
 of the village of Alvechurch in the said parish of
 Alvechurch Painter (hereinafter called my Trustees)
to be the Executors and Trustees of this my
 Will and I bequeath to each of them the sum
 of ten pounds in case they shall respectively prove
 my Will I bequeath to my niece Sarah Anne
 Forster my gold watch and chain.

2. I bequeath all my furniture and all other
 articles of personal or domestic or household use or
 ornament and also all my other jewellery and
 wearing apparel belonging to me unto my two
 nieces Catherine Ashmore the wife of the said
 William Henry Ashmore and the said Sarah Anne
 Forster in equal shares or as near as may be in
 equal shares

3. I devise to the said Catherine Ashmore her
 heirs and assigns All my freehold fields or closes of
 land called Glover Field and Palmer's Piece situate at
 Rounney Green aforesaid And also the messuage or
 dwellinghouse and garden called Gorse Cottage situate




at Rowney Green aforesaid with the appurtenances thereof respectively.

4. I devise to the said Sarah Anne Forster her heirs and assigns my freehold messuage or dwellinghouse at Rowney Green aforesaid now in my own occupation with the outbuildings and garden thereunto belonging and the cottage adjoining thereto, also my freehold cottage and garden opposite my said dwellinghouse and recently purchased by me from Mr Keeling And also the freehold field called The Fleck at Rowney Green aforesaid and four other freehold fields adjoining The Fleck and purchased by me from the Trustees of the late John Griffin and the appurtenances thereof respectively.

5. I bequeath the following legacies all free of death or other duties namely To the said William Henry Ashmore the sum of One hundred pounds To William Forster the husband of the said Sarah Anne Forster the sum of One hundred pounds To my grandnephew Albert Joseph Ashmore the sum of two hundred pounds and To my grandniece Kathleen Mary Forster a like sum of two hundred pounds.

6. I give devise and bequeath all my real and personal estate not hereby otherwise disposed of unto my Trustees Upon trust that my Trustees shall sell call in and convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not consist of money



5 And shall out of the moneys produced by such sale calling in and conversion and out of my ready money pay my funeral and testamentary expenses and debts and the pecuniary legacies bequeathed by my Will or any bequest hereto and the duties on such legacies as aforesaid. And shall stand possessed of the residue of the said moneys In trust for my said two nieces Catherine Ashmore and Sarah Anne Forster in equal shares.

7. I declare that if any of the devisees or legatees mentioned in this my Will shall die in my lifetime leaving issue surviving me then I devise and bequeath the same respectively to his or her children or child who shall be living at my decease and being sons or a son have attained or shall attain the age of twenty one years or being daughters or a daughter ^{or} have attained or shall attain the age ^{or} of twenty one years or being daughters or a daughter ^{or} have attained or shall attain that age or have married or marry if more than one in equal shares and (if freehold property) as tenants in common.
