BE IT KNOWN that *Harriet Bartleet of Te Whare Ashburton in the County of Devon Widow*

This Grant is made upon the condition that no portion of the assets shall be distributed paid during the War to any beneficiary or creditor who is a German, Austro-Hungarian, Turkish or Bulgarian subject, wherever resident, or to anyone on his behalf, or to or on behalf of any person resident in Germany, Austria-Hungary, Turkey or Bulgaria, of whatever nationality, without the express sanction of the Crown, acting through the Treasury; and if any distribution or payment is made contrary to this condition the Grant of Probate or Letters of Administration will be forthwith revoked.

Upon an application to the Solicitor to the Treasury there will be no difficulty in proper cases in obtaining the sanction of the Treasury to the payment of a moderate sum out of the assets to beneficiaries or creditors who are German, Austro-Hungarian, Turkish or Bulgarian subjects resident in this country at the commencement of the War and during the War.

# This is the Last Will and Testament

of me

Harriet Bartleet of Te Whare Awhurton  
in the County of Leon Midow.

I hereby revoke all former testamentary  
dispositions made by me and declare this to be  
my last Will.

I appoint my son Harold Stock &  
Bartleet and my nephew Bernard Stock of  
Kings Norton in the County of Worcester &  
Manufacturer (hereinafter called my Trustees &  
which expression shall include the survivor of  
them or other the trustees or trustee for the  
time being of this my Will) to be the  
Executors and Trustees of this my Will and  
I give to them the sum of twenty pounds  
each for their trouble in acting as such  
Executors and Trustees.

I direct that my body be burnt and  
that my ashes be disposed of as my Trustees  
shall think fit.

I bequeath to my son Albert Bartleet  
the sum of one hundred pounds absolutely.

I bequeath to my said son Albert Bartleet  
any Motor Car of which I may be possessed at  
the time of my death with all tools appliances  
and appurtenances belonging thereto.

I bequeath to my said son Albert



Bequeath all my plate linen china glass books pictures prints furniture and other household effects and all electric plant and fittings belonging to me at the date of my death absolutely.

I bequeath all my jewellery and personal ornaments to such of my daughters and others and according to the directions contained in any paper signed by me attached to this my Will at the time of my death and if I do not make any such directions then the same shall be divided by my Trustees as nearly as may be having regard to the nature thereof in equal shares between my daughters living at my decease.

I give devise and bequeath all the residue of my estate both real and personal unto my Trustees Upon trust that my trustees shall sell call in and convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not consist of money and out of the proceeds of such sale calling in and conversion and out of my ready money pay my funeral and testamentary expenses and debts and the legacies bequeathed by this my Will or any bequest hereto And shall stand possessed of the residue of the said moneys In trust for all my children living at my death in equal shares but if there shall be only one such child then in trust for that child absolutely.
