New End in the parish of Inkberrow in the
county of Worcester Farmer I appoint my
friends Philip Wheeler of Astwood Bank
in the said county of Worcester Friendly Society
Secretary and Thomas Sorrell late of ~~St~~ #
Harrowington in the same county but now
residing with me Farm Labourer (hereinafter
called " my Trustees ") to be the Executors &
and Trustees of this my will I bequeath
to the said Thomas Sorrell the sum of ~~£~~
Twenty pounds I give devise and bequeath
all my real and personal estate whatsoever and
wheresoever unto my Trustees Upon trust that
they shall sell call in collect or otherwise
convert into money such parts of the same
as shall not consist of ready money And
shall out of the moneys to arise from such
sale calling in collection and conversion and
the ready money of which I shall be ~~in~~
possessed at my death pay my funeral and
testamentary expenses and debts and the legacy
hereinbefore bequeathed And shall divide the
residue of the said moneys among and

equally between the following nine persons namely
the said Thomas Sorrell, Eliza Clarke (widow of
my brother Richard Clarke) my nephews and
nieces Thomas Edward, William, Sarah Ann,
Annie and Emma who are the five children of
the said Eliza Clarke my brother John Clarke
and my sister Mary Harvey and so that each
one of the said nine legatees shall be entitled
to a one equal ninth part of my residuary
moneys *In witness* whereof I have hereunto
set my hand this second day of January one
thousand nine hundred and eight.
