John Cox of Moxford in the County of Warwick retired Baker I bequeath to my daughter Jane Freeman my oak bureau and such copper kettle as she shall choose I bequeath my old chair to my son-in-law Cyril Freeman I bequeath my silver watch to my son John Cox I bequeath my pig bench, salting lead, pulleys and ropes and set of steel yards to my son-in-law Cyril Freeman I bequeath the goodwill of my business of a Baker and the stock-in-trade baking plant and effects thereof and the book debts in connection with the said business and my tenancy and interest in the bakehouse to my grandson Frederick Dartington subject to the payment of all debts owing by me in respect of the said business and indemnifying my Executor and my general estate therefrom I give devise and bequeath all the residue of my estate both real and personal unto and to the use of my daughter Emily Cox her heirs executors administrators and assigns according to the nature or tenure thereof absolutely and I appoint my said daughter Emily Cox sole Executrix of this my Will
