

In Her Majesty's High Court of Justice.

BE IT KNOWN, that at the date hereunder written, Letters of Administration of all the Estate which by law devolves to and vests in the personal representative of *William Henry James of Webheath in the County of Worcester fish hook maker*

deceased, who died on the *22nd* day of *March* 1898, at *Webheath aforesaid*

intestate, were granted by Her Majesty's High Court of Justice at the Principal Probate Registry thereof to *William Henry James the natural and lawful son and one of the next of kin*
